Please note that because we have students in the school who are allergic to these products, we do not allow these items at school. This is a severe allergy that can create a life and death situation within a matter of seconds and must be taken very seriously. Thank you for respecting this important directive.

Important Transportation Message:

Please note that due to the fact that several of the ETSB buses are filled to capacity, we will not be allowed to grant any temporary bus passes for children to take different buses to go to a friend's house etc. until after September 30th. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

Cafeteria News:

Once again this year, our cafeteria will be operating 4 days per week. **It will be closed on Mondays.** The cost of the meal once again this year will be **\$5.00**. This includes the main course, dessert and a drink. Please send money with your children to cover the cost of the meal each day, as we have a "no charge policy". We also ask that you send the **exact amount with each child**. This makes it much easier for us to balance our cafeteria books.

Playground Project: We are pleased that our playground project has taken shape and we are now heading into phase two. The most recent addition to our playground, the outdoor classroom, has been a hit with the children thus far. The next step will involve installing a new slide to replace the old red slide, an obstacle course, and a Gaga Ball Court for the Cycle 2 students. We are hoping that this will be done in September. We are still soliciting donations to help pay for phase two and we will be needing "man (or woman) power" for a day or two to help with some installations. Split Classes at L.E.S.: This year we have two split classes at our school; one in cycle 2 and one in cycle 3. This happens occasionally depending on the number of students we have at each grade level. When it does, it sometimes creates anxiety for parents who aren't used to having their children in such classes. It is important to keep in mind that all of our "regular" classes have students who function at different levels and we use individual programs to meet their needs and help them to reach their potential. For example, your children bring home "leveled" reading books that are at their "level". In any given class there may be 10 different levels of books being read for language arts. All this to say, in a split class, the focus, like every other class, is on meeting your child's needs. When forming these classes, we use the same criteria as in the other classes to ensure that the classes are balanced with respect to learning needs, enrichment needs, number of boys and girls, behaviors etc. Should you have questions regarding the curriculum, please feel free to speak to your child's teacher.
