Curriculum Outline-Cycle 3

MATHEMATICS

The Math Program is created to promote the development of various concepts such as; problem solving, graphing, number theory, geometry, measurement, fractions and place value. The math program also introduces the children to math language and teaches them to make the link between math and the real world.

Evaluation takes place through teacher observation, self-evaluation and formal testing.

LANGUAGE ARTS

The goal of the Language Arts Program is to provide reading and writing opportunities to the children on a daily basis in a variety of ways. Language Centers (Daily 5) are part of the program and are designed to provide small group instruction.

Reading

Reading in class will occur daily. Students will go to the library once a week to sign out books in both English and French. In class, leveled books are also assigned.

Writing

Writing in class will take place in many forms such as poetry, personal and fictional narratives and journal writing. Students will take part in the writing process of drafting, revising, editing and publishing. Students will also respond in writing to various texts read to them.

SCIENCE

The science program will be taught in English. The students will learn to explore the world of science and technology through projects, experiments and communication. An emphasis will be placed on identifying problems/issues and proposing explanations/solutions to those problems.

FRENCH

Students will learn to develop their reading, writing and speaking skills using different group activities. A number of projects will be given individually or in groups during the year.

*This year, in French class, your child will be involved in various reading assignments, which can vary from using provided novels or novels each student has chosen. The goal of the assignments is to increase your child's reading level and reading comprehension by reading books that are at their level and of topics they enjoy. **Students are also expected to read for a total of 40 minutes a week.**

*The students will be involved in theme based writing assignments. Language centers (Daily 5) are part of the program and are designed to provide small group instruction.

*Throughout the year your child will be assessed on their reading, writing and oral skills in the form of assignment, formal tests, presentations, teacher evaluations and self-evaluations.

***It is very important that your child communicates in French during French class in order to continually improve their oral skills.**

SOCIAL STUDIES

(taught in French)

Working within the framework of the new curriculum, students will be involved in exploring the geography and history of their country, and the world, during a certain timeline. Through varied projects, students will develop the ability to interpret maps, charts and graphs while becoming more aware of the world around them.

HOMEWORK SCHEDULE

END OF CYCLE EVALUATION (end of Grade 6)
